Our Curriculum at Amotherby CP School caters for children from EYFS to Year 6 and provides children with skills for the 21st Century in Modern Britain. The Curriculum is designed through thematic work with links that are meaningful and add value alongside discrete subject specific work. The curriculum is designed to provide the progressions of skills and challenge. Our curriculum is driven by ensuring that it meets the distinctive needs of all our pupils and takes into account their personal contexts.

All learners are involved in planning their curriculum and teachers take into account their previous learnt knowledge, correct any misconceptions, their interests and life experiences.

Skills are broken down into year groups with challenge and support given to individualise learning which provides continuity and progression across the school.

The application of English, Maths and Computing is applied to all subject areas. Time is given to allow children to reflect and review their learning in order to maximise their skills based knowledge.

All stakeholders in the Amotherby community are involved in the children's learning and where possible first hand experiences are sought to develop independent, confident, inquisitive children to enable them to reach their full potential.
